Dear Essendon North Parents and Carers,

Essendon North Primary School is looking forward to another great year of learning and teaching and would like to advise you of Essendon North Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2025. Victorian Government Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. The ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education for our students, supporting our school to provide the programs, resources, and materials to foster learning outcomes. We want to thank you for all your ongoing support. Your financial contributions continue to make a significant impact on the programs we offer and the education of our students.

As highlighted in the Department of Education and Training's (DET) Parent Payments Policy (please see the one-page overview contained within this document) there are three categories for parent payment requests and these are outlined below:

Curriculum Contributions: Curriculum Contributions are voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions: Other Contributions are voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities: Extra-Curricular Items and Activities are items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free in order to deliver the Curriculum. Extra-Curricular Items and Activities are provided on a user-pays basis. They include optional excursions and camps, optional sporting or music programs, and materials that don't relate to the Curriculum such as school magazines.





For 2025, we have engaged the services of Officeworks to be our supplier to provide students with classroom materials. At ENPS we make every effort to keep the cost of items and activities affordable for all parents. To streamline the process, we have organised for Officeworks to deliver bulk orders of materials to the 2025 Home Group Teacher. All curriculum consumable items listed below and resources will be in classrooms and accessible for the first day of school.

In the instances of shared parental responsibility, Essendon North Primary School can send duplicate Parent Payment Arrangements to all parties with parental responsibility and asks parents to decide who is responsible for making payment and in what proportions.

The School Council of Essendon North Primary School determines the parent payments each year in line with the Victorian DET guidelines. Parent payments are requested to enhance the educational opportunities for our students, and further enrich the learning and teaching programs. Parent contributions in all forms are highly valued by our school community as they ensure our students can access a broad range of learning opportunities. At ENPS the financial contribution support has allowed us to enhance digital learning opportunities, increase classroom resources and upgrade curriculum equipment, including mathematics, literacy and science resources.

Refunds

In line with Essendon North Primary School policies, if a camp or excursion is cancelled or altered by the school, or a student is no longer able to attend part or all of the camp or excursion, our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents/carers on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will provide information about refunds to parents/carers at the time of payment.

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis.

Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.

Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
